



Pine Nursery Park Information Sheet For Public Events

Thank you for considering Pine Nursery Park for your community event. This sheet is intended to provide you with information specific to Pine Nursery Park. The *Guidelines for Public Events in Community Parks* (available on the BPRD website) has general park use information.

LOCATION:

Pine Nursery Park is located in NE Bend between Purcell, Deschutes Market, and Yeoman Roads.

AVAILABILITY:

Pine Nursery Park is home to many District-affiliated sporting events and tournaments in addition to other uses. Due to the park's size, areas of it may be reserved by more than one user at any given time. Each rental use proposal will be considered in the context of other uses and maintenance needs.

The event season is April 15 - October 15.

HOURS:

Park hours are 5:00 am – 10:00 pm.

CAPACITY:

Capacity is dependent on event features, layout and other park uses.

PARKING/VEHICLES:

- Parking is available in designated parking areas only. Visitor parking is not available on turf or natural areas.
- Event-use parking on turf may be allowed only as prescribed in the event logistics plan and approved by the District with applicable permits.
- Event visitors must be informed as to allowable parking locations.

AMPLIFIED SOUND and NOISE

Use of amplified sound and noise limitations are defined in Deschutes County code (Chapter 8.08).

AMENITIES:

The District has developed approx. 120 of the 159 acres of the park. Current amenities include:

- Multi-use sports field complex
- Pickle ball complex
- 9-hole disc golf course
- Fishing/irrigation pond (stocked)
- 1.3 miles paved path, bike/pedestrian walking/running loop (with adjacent natural trail)
- Restrooms
- Fully fenced, 14 acre off-leash area for dogs
- 345 vehicle parking spaces

ADA:

The American's with Disability Act (ADA) is a federal civil rights law that prohibits discrimination against people with disabilities and opens doors for full participation in all aspects of everyday life. BPRD will provide guidelines that are intended to help event organizers design events to accommodate people of all abilities. This information is not intended to be an all-inclusive guide to ADA compliance.

It is the responsibility of the event organizer to understand and comply with all federal regulations that pertain to the Americans with Disabilities Act.

SET UP/TAKE DOWN:

Set up and start time will be determined at the pre-event meeting with the District event team. Event organizer needs to be present for set up and take down.

Animals at Events:

Dogs must be leashed in all District parks and facilities except in designated off-leash areas. Event managers may prohibit individuals from bringing animals into an area where a special event is being held. This prohibition does not apply to service animals.

Any variance to these park use conditions must be pre-approved by Bend Park & Recreation District.
